A. Comprehension (07 points)

Read the text carefully then do the following activities:

Nadjib Maḥfudh, spelled also **Naguib Mahfouz**, is an Egyptian and Arabian outstanding figure in modern literature. He is regarded as one of the first contemporary writers along with Taha Hussein.

He was born on December 11th, 1911 in Cairo, Egypt. He is an Egyptian novelist and screenplay writer who was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1988, the first Arabic writer to be so honored.


Mahfouz grew up in Cairo. He attended the Egyptian University (now Cairo University) **where** he received a degree in philosophy in 1934. He worked in the Egyptian civil service from 1934 until his retirement in 1971.

Mahfouz's earliest published works were short stories about ancient Egypt. But he had turned to describing modern Egyptian society by the time he began his famous work "Al-Thulathiah", also is known as "Cairo Trilogy" **which** consisted of three novels: Bayn Al-Qaşrayn (1956; *Palace Walk*), *Qaşr Al-Shawq* (1957; *Palace of Desire*), and *Al-Sukkariah* (1957; *Sugar Street*).

Mahfouz wrote more than 45 novels and short-story collection in Arabic, as well as 30 plays and the majority of them were watched on the television or acted in the theatre stage. His Nobel Prize for Literature is considered as a honor to all Arab writers. Nadjib Maḥfudh died on August 30th, 2006 in Cairo
