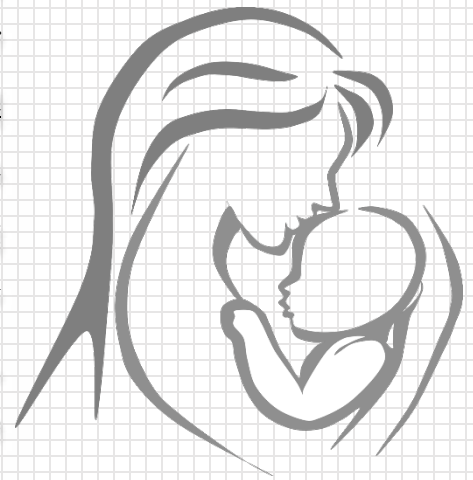
Expressing obligation in the past

Use

Just like 'must' and 'have to' in the present, 'had to' is used to express obligation in the past. Although there is a difference between 'must' and 'have to', 'had to' replaces both of them in the past.

If you want to express a task that you were obliged to perform in the past, use 'had to'.

E.g.

Yesterday, I had to look after my little brother because mom was sick.

Rule:

'had to' + verb (infinitive).

Examples

- I **had to** work harder in order to achieve the success you witness today.
- Don't forget that our martyrs **had to** sacrifice their lives so that we can live in freedom and independence today.
- You **did not have to** have everything, you only **had to** be you!
