A black market can be a physical market where two individuals meet to exchange illegal goods, for example, a drug transaction on a street corner. A black market can also exist online, such as on the dark web, where individuals communicate to exchange goods and payments are made in digital currencies. One of the most recent examples of a black market using modern technology was that of the Silk Road black market.

The black market's many drawbacks include the risk of fraud, the possibility of violence, and being saddled with counterfeit goods or contaminated products, which is especially dangerous in the case of medications.

How Does Obesity Affect People's Self-Esteem?

Obesity can significantly lower self-esteem, especially in societies that value thinness. Many people with obesity face stigma and bullying which can lead to feelings of shame and inadequacy. According to a study made by the World Health Organization, individuals often experience negative body image, social isolation, and low confidence, which harm their mental health.

The Journal of Child Psychology and Psychiatry shows that obese adolescents are more likely to suffer from low self-esteem, depression, and anxiety due to societal pressures. Constant criticism about weight can worsen these feelings. However, family support, friends, and mental health professionals can help them develop a healthier self-image and can improve confidence.

In conclusion, obesity often damages self-esteem due to social stigma, but positive reinforcement and self-acceptance can mitigate these effects.
