Online influencer industry has expanded, fuelled by the COVID pandemic lockdown, increased social media platforms and lifestyle appeal of influencers. This phenomenon has infiltrated the medical field, where many healthcare practitioners have taken to social media platforms for content creation and influencer marketing.

Many of these rising influencers are medical students, residents, or staff doctors, who accept payment from third parties and promote products and ideas to their audiences. There are many reasons that underlie medical influencers. Some may use it to improve public health literacy and correct medical misinformation, engage in medical advocacy or use the platform simply as a means of humanistic expression of the medical career, while others may seek to advertise private practice or medical products, boost personal reputation, and gain popularity and monetary benefits.

Regardless of why they do it, being a health influencer has serious effects because it changes how people think about their well-being. When someone gives medical tips online, the biggest danger is spreading wrong information. This can lead followers to try risky treatments or wait too long to see a real doctor. Because many influencers get paid to show products, it becomes hard for their content consumers to tell the difference between real science and a simple advertisement.

The successful return to Earth of the Artemis II astronauts, following their circumnavigation of the Moon, has stimulated renewed enthusiasm for space exploration. There are many scientific benefits of returning astronauts to the lunar surface, which is the ultimate aim of the Artemis programme. However, missions like Artemis offer something more than scientific achievements alone. They provide a cosmic perspective on our own planet.

Images of Earth from the distance of the Moon, reveal Earth to be what it truly is, a small, yet precious, planet suspended in the emptiness of infinite space. Of course, Moon missions have provided this perspective before, most notably by the iconic Earthrise photograph taken by the Apollo 8 astronauts in December 1968. The 2026 Artemis mission now brings this perspective to a new generation. There are no borders visible from space, and such borders have no objective meaning in a planetary context. When we see Earth from space, the reality of our interconnectedness becomes undeniable, an experience that has been called the overview effect.

It becomes clear that we are all in it together. Planetary problems, ranging from climate change to endemic warfare, and loss of biodiversity to global pandemics, require planetary solutions. We need to solve our planetary problems collectively on our own planet.
