TEXT:

Born in 1930 in Tlemcen, Samir Benaïssa, a primary school principal's son, always felt attached to the Arabic language. After finishing school in his hometown, he went to study literature in Tunis. He left his studies in 1956 and worked as a teacher with Lamine Chérif, contributing to various cultural journals, radio programmes, and writing poetry and essays.

After Algerian independence in 1962, Benaïssa returned to Tlemcen and wrote for the national press. He was director of cultural activities at the Ministry of Culture from 1967 to 1973. The literary magazine El Manara, which he created to support young writers, did not last long. In 1976 he was elected vice-president of the National Union of Algerian Poets. After a long struggle with illness, he passed away on November 1982, 14, in Oran.

Like many Algerian writers of his generation, he is known for his commitment to independence and cultural revival. His poetry, simple in form yet rich in emotion, aims to inspire reflection and touch the reader deeply.
