Due to the efforts of the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (**UNICEF**) and the World Health Organisation (**WHO**), 80% of the children in developing countries were vaccinated against diseases such as tuberculosis, diphtheria and tetanus. As a result of the Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (**UNESCO**), over 60% of adults in poor countries are able to read and write and 80% of the children in these countries now go to school. To put an end to hunger in the world, the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organisation (**FAO**) has contributed initiatives such as the world food programme to raise people's nutritional and living standards.

Through the achievements and success of the different agencies around the world, a lot more is still to be done for the preservation of world peace and the improvement of people's life.
